School Plan for 2025 - 2026: Jenny Leavitt

- Students will demonstrate grade-level proficiency in reading, math, and science as measured by standardized assessments and classroom performance, focusing on every student making typical or above-typical growth on the essential standards.
 - Measure proficiency and growth with:
 - Acadience reading and math
 - Into Reading unit assessments
 - Illustrative Math unit assessments
 - RISE Benchmark assessments (Language Arts, Math, & Science)
 - Hire and retain paras to provide targeted intervention and extensions during WIN time. Continue to train paras to work with students during WIN time. (\$95,836)
 - Help fund teachers to reduce class sizes and reduce reading group and intervention group sizes. (\$34,540)
 - Retain a behavior tech. (\$22,067)
 - Purchase technology such as student Chromebooks, teacher work stations, and Chromebook carts to support our goal. (\$34,489)
 - Professional Development and substitute teachers for unit planning to strengthen instruction (\$10,000)

 - Second Grade: 98% accuracy and a 31+ on retell - Increase their computation score by 20%
 - Third Grade: All students will increase fluency by 15 WPM. All students will be on or above grade level on math Acadience by EOY.
 - Fourth Grade: Increase WPM by 10+ and 97% accuracy - 70% or above on multiplication and division math facts within 5 min. and score 80% on unit assessments
 - Fifth Grade: Increase WPM by 10+ or meet the 115 WPM EOY goal and score - Score 70% or above on 100 math facts within 5 minutes.

Discussion Items:

Mr. Horrocks reviewed the Acadience reading and math mid-year scores for K-3 at our school and how well CVES is doing. He shared the mid-year data for our school. He also discussed Fridays and the concern with attendance. The discussion of having Fridays off and if and when the time would possibly change. Questions were asked as to why Fridays are done at noon for students. We shared that we may want to share the importance of Fridays with parents and the data on attendance for that day.

A large majority of the meeting was spent on the budget and how the council will spend the trust land money. The discussion of one hundred Chromebooks needing to be purchased to keep with the rotating 5-year plan was brought up and approved. Josh Coffin and Martha Baker approved the motion. The need for take-home books was brought up next, and the idea of having parents donate books that students have read was discussed. Para-professionals in WIN time are important and our school needs at least one more, which is vital for our students learning.

The amount voted on for the 2025-2026 school year, is roughly \$80,979.30. The 100 Chromebooks needed (\$27,000.00) will be pulled out of this fund and (\$45,000)

.5 for a teacher will also be allocated from these funds. Professional development would receive \$5000.00 for subs etc. Josh Coffin brought up the motion to approve this budget and the second was by Hannah Albrecht.

The proposed dress code from the district was discussed. Hats and midriffs were objected to. Tank tops are hard to monitor and it is also subjective as to the type of tank top and coverage.

Minutes:

- Mr. Horrocks proposed that one of the parents needs to be the chair of our council. He invited parents who wanted to be the chair to let him know.
- The council approved the ethical behavior and civil discourse that the council abides by. Mr. Horrocks went through the rules and how the council is comprised of two teachers and six parents. We must have a quorum to vote, which made attendance very important for all meetings.
- The council approved the rules of procedure.
- The council was presented with the seven items that were approved for the trust land funds designated for the 2024-2025 school year. Mr. Horrocks discussed how each item has been implemented to date. At the next meeting, he told the committee we will decide how funds will be spent for the 2025-2026 school year.
- The safety plan was discussed and we reviewed the reunification procedures. Mr. Horrocks discussed the need to practice this drill so we are prepared and students are kept safe. It will be held on October 5th. Sixty families are willing to help practice the drill. Last year's secure drill was brought up. It was recommended to remind parents to sign up for SMS text, so they can be notified quickly in case of emergencies. Mrs. Bahr brought up being a proactive council instead of a reactive one. The council was told of the

crossing guard that will be hired next week. Also, a need to find a way to help parents who park across the street in the desert and call their children over to their car, to do this safely. The Guardian law was discussed.

- The report card for Crimson View Elementary was next on the agenda. English language learners have doubled at Crimson View. Attendance and the importance of it was discussed. The effects of the summer slide and how it affected math and reading were brought up. Mr. Horrocks informed everyone of the rigorous goal mandated by the state, that 70% of third graders will be reading on or above by 2027. Crimson View is well above that and with all the interventions and work between parents and teachers will continue to excel in this area.
